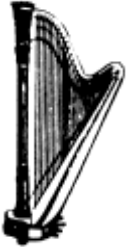

Cecilia Ilg McKay has been playing the harp since she was eight years old. She studied privately under Professor Laura Erb (of the Baldwin-Wallace Conservatory of Music) for 11 years - from 1961-1972. She has been providing services for private engagements such as weddings, receptions, memorial services, anniversary celebrations, corporate dinners, etc. She has performed with the Lorain County Civic Orchestra, the TrueNorth Symphony and Chorale, in many musicals, and plays on a regular basis at various local churches. Cecilia has released three CD's, containing popular music, Christmas music and Christian favorites. They are available for \$16 (includes tax).

April 3, 2:30 pm -Brian Bigley, Irish Singer and dancer- Brian comes from a musical family on Cleveland's West side. At age 8 he began studying with Achill Island piper Michael Kilbane, where he learned to play the Uilleann pipes. He also studied the art of pipe making with Seth Gallagher and master flute maker Patrick Olwell to become a pipe maker, which he currently does. Brian is also a world-class Irish step dancer and has toured extensively throughout North America and Europe as a piper, flute and whistle player, and dancer.
