foundation funds new tech

The Ritter Public Library Foundation is funding the purchase of two interactive digital tables. One will be placed in the Children's department, the other in the Community Engagement Room. The new multi-touch tables will offer a selection of multiplayer games. Kids and families will enjoy options like tic tac toe or educational spelling games, while more advanced users like teens and adults can try competitive Sudoku or classics like dominoes.

The interactive tables will join other recent contributions from the Foundation, including the new mobile device charging station in the library commons. The self-service charging station allows patrons to secure their device in a locked compartment,

and features both USB-C and Lightning cables to charge a variety of devices.

The Ritter Public Library Foundation appreciates gifts of any size, if you would like to make a contribution toward the interactive tables. The Foundation works to bridge the gap between the library's needs and state funding, to ensure that our library remains one of the best in the area.
